Senators are expected to attend a monthly WebEx meeting, gather state updates, meet when necessary with fellow committee members, and attend the MAATA Student Program at the District Symposium.

Mission Statement

The purpose of the Mid-Atlantic Athletic Trainers' Association (MAATA) Student Senate is to provide students with an opportunity to develop leadership skills and prepare future leaders within the athletic training profession. This organization will give a voice to the students within the Mid-Atlantic Athletic Trainers' Association.


all other athletic training students. After graduation, Jenna hopes to work with hockey or soccer athletes at the collegiate or professional level.


